1. Birds

White throated Magpie-Jay (*Calocitta formosa*)
Srub Eufonia (*Euphonia affinis*),
Squirrel Cuckoo (*Piaya cayana*),
Blue-crowned Motmot (*Momotus momota*),
Stripe-headed Sparrow (*Aimophila ruficauda*)
Cinnamon humming bird (*Amazilia rutila*)
Rufous capped warbler (*Basileuterus rufifrons*)
Black vulture (*Coragyps atratus*)
Turkey vulture (*Cathartes aura*)

2. Reptiles

Pointed head Python (*Loxocemos bicolor*), not registered in this National Park so far
Central American rattlesnake (*Crotalus simus*), *venemous*
Juvenile black lizard (*Ctenosaura similis*)
Central American Lyre snake (*Trimorphodon quadruplex*)

3. Mammals

Hairy-legged Vampire (*Diphylla ecaudata*), not registered in the Park so far
Seba's short tailed Bat (*Carollia perspicillata*),
Palla's Long-tongued bat (*Glossophaga soricina*) and as a surprise as well a
Southern opossum (*Dedelfis marsupialis*)
Southern cotton rat (*Sigmodon hirsutus*)
White-faced capuchins (*cebus capucinus*)
White-tailed Deer (*odocoileus virginianus*)
Coyote (*canis latrans*)

4. Plants

Gumbo-limbo (*Bursera simaruba*) - hurricane resistant, resin is used as glue and vanish, timber is good for light construction
Coca bush (*Erythroxylon aerolatum*) belongs to the Coca family, known for its alkaloids, includes cocaine.
Nance (*Byrsonima crassifolia*) medicinal uses against fever and diarrhea, food provider for insects, hummingbirds and parakeets
Barbasco (*Lonchocarpus utilis*) used for fish poisoning in rivers
Horse Testicals (*Stemmadenia obovata*) used to produce slings
Yellow elder (*Tecoma stans*) fodder for livestock
Frangipani (*Plumeria rubra*) ornamental use
Custard-apple (*Annona reticulata*) edible fruit
